## Diversity Competent care includes:

- Practicing self-awareness and overcome judgements, prejudices and biases.
- Establishing connection and trust with clients and families.
- Treating clients with respect, warmth and empathy.
- Supporting clients to share their experiences and stories...listening deeply.



## Diversity Competent care includes:

- Engaging clients to identify their own health issues and priorities.
- Engage clients and families in care planning.
- Understanding and respecting client values and perspectives
- Becoming aware of the client's social and non-medical circumstances



## Diversity Competent care includes:

- Becoming aware of community resources and referring clients/families as needed.
- Using plain language to explain things.
- Using interpretation services as needed (ASH-Language Line).



#### Remember:

 You are not expected to know everything about your clients. Diversity competency is not a recipe based approach. The key is to develop trust and genuine relationships.
